


# Add Links To Emails 📧

Links that you add to campaign sequence emails serve more than one purpose:


- They track engagement. Link clicks are recorded and taken into account on various reports. The links give email recipients a way to interact with the content you send to them.
- They serve specific purposes. Opt-in and opt-out links are designed to help you follow email marketing best practices and minimize spam complaints.
- They can satisfy campaign goals. The links you add to emails can be identified as a goal method that moves a contact from one campaign sequence to another.

## Add links to emails


1. Select the text or image you would like to hyperlink and then click on the **Link** icon to add your link.



2. Select a link type from the drop down. Note, the only link types that can trigger a link click goal are URL, File download, Webform, and Order Form.
  - **URL:** Enter the full URL of the website: *https://yourwebsite.com/blog/business.*
  - **Email address:** Enter an email address: *rachel.baker@yourwebsite.com.*
  - **Phone number:** A phone number link will allow the recipient to tap the link on their phone and place a call.
  - **File download:** This link type allows the recipient to click the link and download a file to their computer or other device. You can choose a file that is in your company **filebox**, or upload a new file.
  - **Landing Page:** Select from a list of published **legacy** landing pages that you have built in the campaign builder (this option is only compatible with legacy landing pages).
  - **Web form:** Select from a list of published web forms that you have built in the campaign builder.
  - **Order form:** Select from a list of published order forms that you have built in the campaign builder.
3. (Optional) You can tell Infusionsoft to add a tag to the contact record when the recipient clicks the link. This helps you segment your contacts based on their interactions with your email content.
  1. Click the **Tag** button.



2. You can start typing the name of an existing tag to find it in the drop-down, or you can just create a new tag as shown below and click the **Create Tag** button.



4. Click on the **Insert Link** button to add the link to the email.
